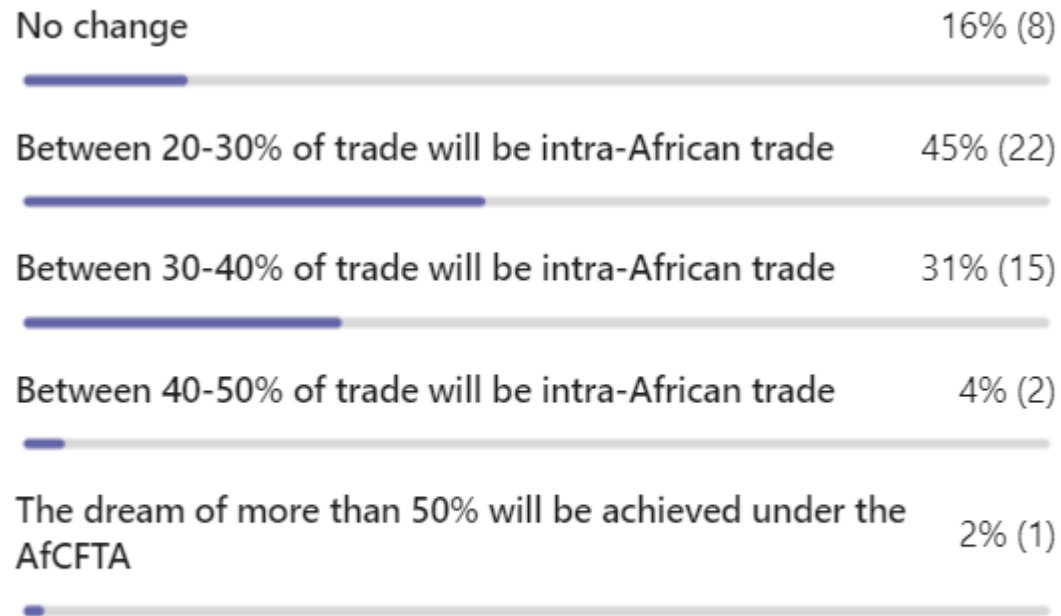

No, only MNEs are set to benefit. 3% (2)

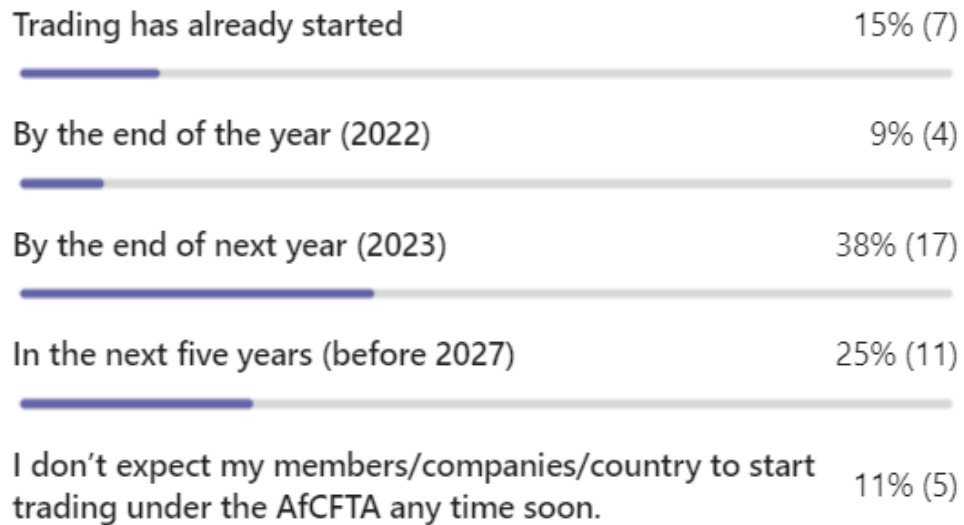
There will be little benefit from the AfCFTA for either SMMEs or MNEs. 11% (6)
